## Spring and Summer Internships

#### **Program Overview**

Crown Ridge is offering internships where students will gain valuable knowledge and working experience with tigers and lions which can be later used to further one's career in the animal field. We have 2 internships to offer this summer and 2 this fall. Our internships are non-paid but students can receive credit in some cases and will receive valuable hands on experience. Interns will participate in the daily care and management of tigers and lions (diet prep, exhibit maintenance, etc.), participate in public tours, and gain a better understanding of animal training, enrichment, and behavior. They will give tours to the general public and participate in group education. Students will also learn about the operation of a non-profit sanctuary, fundraising, and USDA regulations. Lodging is available near the sanctuary for interns free of charge.

Work hours are generally from 8am to 4pm, 4 days a week including weekends. Interns are required to write a summary of their experience, create a new enrichment item, as well as other projects. We are asking for a 10 week commitment as well. This is a great opportunity for students to get hands on animal care experience while learning about the importance of conservation work.

Applicants must be hardworking, focused, dedicated, and able to work independently or in a team environment. The work is physical and primarily performed outdoors in all types of weather.

### Tiger Corridor

#### Problem:

Tigers are on the verge of extinction with only 3,200 wild tigers left. Tigers are threatened by poaching and habitat loss. Habitats have become fragmented making it more difficult for one population of tigers to reach another. If healthy tiger populations do not have access to one another, breeding becomes more difficult. Tigers now only have 7% of their historic range which continues to decline.



#### Solution:

Recently tigers have been discovered at much higher altitudes than researchers previously thought possible. With the discovery of tigers in Himalayas in several countries, including Bhutan, a new plan of action has formed; the tiger corridor. The tiger corridor could "act as a tiger nursery from which tigers could breed safely and spread out to repopulate forests of some of the surrounding countries." Bhutan plays the connecting puzzle piece by linking tiger populations from Nepal into Bhutan and Northern India through Myanmar, Thailand, Lao P.D.R., Cambodia, and ending in Malaysia. By connecting these countries in carefully planned corridors the government is providing safe ways for tigers to survive in human dominated areas. This is a long term strategy in hopes of not only preventing tigers from becoming extinct but to help tigers repopulate naturally and roam freely once again

#### How You Can Help:

Forest clearing for illegal logging and agricultural cash crops destroys tiger habitat and is a major threat to the survival of tigers. Harvesting palm oil is destroying the forest in which many endangered animals live, including tigers. Over half of the products we use contain palm oil, often disguised under vegetable oil. Check for alternative products that use a sustainable source of palm oil. Or help by spreading awareness and putting pressure on major companies to switch to a sustainable source. Visit change.org for petitions concerning the use of palm oil.

Here is a list of ways you can support companies that are implementing sustainable practices:

- Buy 100% postconsumer recycled paper, <u>FSC-certified wood and paper products</u>
- Buy sustainable coffee: Look for the label of a recognized independent certifier like the <u>Rainforest Alliance</u>, <u>Fair Trade</u>, <u>UTZ</u>
  <u>Certified</u> and <u>Smithsonian Migratory Bird Center Bird Friendly</u>
